(Some) Challenges for Bladder Health

- Bladder health is insufficiently defined.
- Awareness of bladder disease/dysfunction is low.
- Diversity of bladder dysfunction and the phenotypic characteristics are under-recognized.
- Etiologies for bladder disease are poorly understood.
 - How to maintain or restore bladder health
 - How to avoid contributors to (i.e., prevent) bladder disease/dysfunction
- Difficult to break the cycle of low research funding.

Urology Care Foundation Grant Programs

- Summer Medical Student Fellowships
 - \$4,000 stipend for ten-week summer research training
 - 46 funded since 2010
- Residency Research Awards
 - \$40,000/yr to support residency 6- to 12-month research training
 - Requires institutional match
 - 10 funded since 2010

Research Scholar Awards

- \$40,000/yr for one-year or two-year mentored training for clinical and postdoctoral fellows, juniorr faculty
- Over 550 funded since 1975


Rising Stars in Urology Research Awards (Astellas/Hinman)

- Up to \$200,000 total for up to five years of salary support for urologists with external career development award
- 21 funded since 2005



- 1. Work on Both Legislative and Non-legislative Fronts
 - A. Legislative (Congress)
 - i. Individual Champions, e.g.
 - a. Senator Durbin
 - ii. Congressional caucuses, e.g.
 - a. NIH caucus
 - b. Men's Health Caucus
 - iii. Advocacy coalitions, e.g.
 - a. "Friends of ..."
 - b. Defense Health Research Consortium
 - c. OAB Roundtable





Legislative Advocacy Success Story #1



Blocked Cuts to Federal Funding for Urologic Research

➤ Senate amendment proposed that, starting in Fiscal Year 2016, would have cut all urologic research funding to the DoD Congressionally

Directed Medical Research Programs (i.e., > \$100 million for prostate cancer, kidney cancer, interstitial cystitis and bladder/ urinary dysfunction secondary to other conditions, e.g., spinal cord injury, tuberous sclerosis)

- ➤ Defense Health Research Consortium (AUA is Executive Committee member) rapid effort to obtain 64 sign-ons to letter reinforcing the importance of the funding for innovative research to help patients
- > In response, Senator rescinded amendment before voting.



Legislative Advocacy Success Story #2



Added Bladder Cancer Research as a Fundable Topic in DoD PRMRP

- ➤ Bladder cancer obvious void in federal funding for research, e.g., NIH, DoD
- ➤ Raised awareness with AUA letter highlighting:
 - o Mortality and morbidity in comparison to other funded topic areas
 - Major disparities in funding
- ➤ Made the request
- ➤ Had the right champion (staffer in House Appropriations Committee; HAC-D)
- ➤ In response, HAC-D added bladder cancer to the congressionally directed FY16 topics for PRMRP funding.



Legislative Advocacy Success Story #3 (In Progress)



Federal and State Proclamations of Bladder Health Awareness Month

- ➤ Spawned from AUA Urology Care Foundation's "It's Time to Talk about OAB" Awareness Campaign (commercial partner funding)
- > Effort now inclusive of full scope of bladder health and disease
- ➤ Potential to leverage for:
 - Public awareness and education for UAB and other bladderrelated challenges
 - Research advocacy for UAB and other bladder-related challenges



Campaign Overview

Overall Campaign Goals:

- 1. Identify overactive bladder (OAB) as a public health issue.
- 2. Establish a new connection between patients and their physicians, providing both with tools to open a conversation for diagnosis and therapy.
- 3. In conjunction with the healthcare community, patients and advocates, launch a multi-phased, national education campaign to break the stigma of OAB

 - i. Federal Funders (NIH, VA)
 - a. NIH Advisory Councils
 - b. Institutional Centers (IC) Directors and Program Officers
 - c. Multiple ICs (e.g., NCI, NIDDK, NIA, NICHD, NIEHS)
 - ii. Other Major Funders
 - a. PCORI (Patient-Centered Outcomes Research Institute)
 - » AUA-driven urologic research funding priorities
 - » Opportunities for AUA/Academic collaborations
 - Commercial partners
 - » Opportunities for AUA/Private Practice/Academic collaborations




